


CISP BY THE NUMBERS

Countries represented by the student body: 30


CURRICULUM

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)


We are continuing our partnership with the College Board during the 2023-2024 school year. In May of 2023, 9 CISP students took a total of 11 AP exams. Of those, 89% or 8 students scored a three or above on their exams! Over the summer, we had 2 teachers take AP training to prepare for the possibility of offering more AP classes. In the 2023-2024 school year, we are offering 2 AP classes, and we look forward to continuing to develop our AP program.

MAP TESTING

MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) is a test given twice a year to our students grade 3 through grade 12: once in the fall and again in the spring. We use this test to measure academic progress in the areas of mathematics, reading, and language usage. These results represent a comparison of our school to schools in the US who take the MAP tests, as well as to other schools similar to CISP, international, Englishspeaking schools. We are excited that our students consistently perform at or above the levels of their peers in both the US and in international schools.
