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

CISP is accredited by ACSI (Association of Christian Schools International) which is an accreditation agency that supports Christian schools around the world. CISP was first accredited by ACSI in 2013. The accreditation process verifies the education CISP provides. Completing this process shows that the school is willing to examine itself and wishes to improve.

After over a year postponement due to Covid, ACSI was finally able to send an accreditation team to CISP in November. Teachers and staff prepared for the visit working in small groups to create reports about different areas of the school.

During the visit, the team observed classes, reviewed our safety procedures, and talked with teachers, students and parents. The ACSI team presented their findings and recommended CISP for re-accreditation, giving four commendations and four recommendations to be working on for our next reaccreditation visit in 2029.

COMMENDATIONS

- 1) There is consistent commitment by the executive leadership, faculty, and staff to advance the philosophy, mission, and vision of the school.
- 2) Teachers actively and effectively use technology to engage students in the learning process.
- 3) The school has developed policies and procedures that promote child safety; define conduct expectations for staff and volunteers; and provide training for staff, volunteers, and students. Staff training includes legal reporting responsibilities in cases of alleged or suspected child abuse, neglect, or other areas in which reporting is mandated.
- 4) Board, administration, faculty, staff, and student interactions reflect the attitude of Christ. Communication among faculty and staff clearly demonstrates sensitivity and responsiveness to the individual needs, interests, and temperaments of the students.





RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) Develop and implement a systematic plan for regular faculty and support staff evaluation leading to intentional professional development aligned with specific individual and schoolwide goals.
- 2) Revise and expand curriculum guides to ensure course stability within a culture of high faculty turnover, and train existing and new teachers to effectively use those guides for consistent instructional planning.
- 3) Develop and implement a systematic plan for analyzing and using assessment data to improve curricular and instructional practices.
- 4) Collaborate with stakeholders to re-establish traditions and create new opportunities for community fellowship while resuming a post-pandemic "new normal."



CURRICULUM UPDATES

CISP is in the process of documenting all of the standards, student outcomes, concepts and skills that make up the curriculum in the Curriculum Trak system. CISP is also establishing new processes to record, maintain and regularly evaluate the curriculum for effectiveness in fulfilling the mission to provide an education that is biblically based, academically excellent and practically oriented.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

In May of 2021, CISP administered 20 AP Exams with 14 students participating. Out of the 20 exams taken, 14 received passing scores with two students earning a "5" (the highest score) on their respective exams.

In the 2020-21 school year, CISP had three "AP Scholars" - students who earned passing scores on three different AP exams. CISP had two "AP Scholars with Honor" - students who earned passing scores on four different AP exams. More impressively, each of these exams are administered in English and all five of these students use English as a second or third language.



ADMISSIONS & MAP TESTING

CISP's enrollment is currently at 129 full time and 6 part time students. The student body represents 23 countries! 27 students are enrolled in CISP's ELL (English Language Learner) program. Only about 60% of our students speak English at home and nearly 50% of our students speak at least two languages.

Each year CISP conducts MAP Growth testing - a standardized yet customized testing program to evaluate our students' growth in Math and Language Arts (both reading and language usage). The tests are administered in the Fall and Spring each year.

This year, the Fall testing session revealed impressive growth figures in several of our student groups:

- 10th Grade: 50% of students in this class scored Above Average in English Language Arts. Additionally, 56% of the students in this class scored Above Average in Math.
- 73% of 4th graders scored Above Average in Math
- 65% of 11th graders scored Above Average in English Language Arts
